As you may be aware, big things are happening in British Columbia at the Ministry of Education. Over the past few years a new approach to teaching and learning has been introduced, researched and is now being implemented in Kindergarten to Grade 9.

This is being done so kids learn the skills they need to succeed in our changing world. With a redesigning of the curriculum we also need to develop a new approach to reporting.

The new provincial curriculum is designed to engage the passions and interests of our students to better meet their personalized needs. With these changes, quality assessment practices and communication of student learning takes on increased significance. The tools we are introducing this year to communicate student learning, will allow for more responsive ways to keep parents informed and involved in their child's school experience.

The district's goal is to design a reporting system that fully engages teachers, students and parents. It is no longer just about the three reporting periods or the report card, but more about how to authentically communicate student learning and support learners in reaching their potential.

School-based and district-wide parent information sessions will occur during the 2016-17 year. More details will be coming home soon about information meeting for Chase River School families.

SCHOOL CLOSURE DUE TO SNOW

It is that time of year again, when the school district would like to remind parents about school closure procedures. The most common reasons that schools might be closed are dangerous road conditions due to a heavy snowfall or ice.

If you are wondering if schools are open on a particular day, for the most current updates listen to local radio stations (WAVE $102.3~\mathrm{FM}$ and WOLF $106.9~\mathrm{FM}$) in the mornings.

We also attempt to put an announcement of any school closure on the school district website, www.sd68.bc.ca, and on Twitter and Facebook, but our ability to do so could be affected by such things as power outages and technical issues. If there is no announcement on the website or social media, please be sure to listen to local radio stations.

We would like to remind parents that it is their right to make the final decision as to whether it is safe for their children to travel to school on any given day. While the district strives to make the best decision possible for students across the district, there may be circumstances in your neighbourhood that lead you to decide to keep your children home, even though schools are open.



The Great British Columbia Shake Out!

On October 20th at 10:15 am Chase River Elementary will again participate in this GIGANTIC EARTHQUAKE DRILL. Like all schools in Nanaimo / Ladysmith, students practice the Drop, Cover and Hold-on procedure followed by a complete exit from the building. Students learn how to count until the shaking stops and discussed what to do in the event of an earthquake in a variety of circumstances. We encourage all our families to join in on this drill at home or at work. You should be able to tune into local radio stations to follow along.

Parent / Teacher Interviews

Parent / Teacher interviews are scheduled for Monday, Oct. 17 to Thursday, Oct. 20. Children are dismissed at the *regular time, 1:27pm, on Monday and 1:07pm for the rest of the week*. Friday is a Professional Development day so the children stay home. Letters have gone home to confirm meeting times. If you are unable to make the assigned meeting time, please contact the school to arrange a mutually agreeable time and dated. Teachers are looking forward to meeting with you to briefly discuss your child/children's progress to date. We hope you will work with your child to establish some social and educational goals for our first term and the year.

Criminal Record Check required for ALL volunteer work in schools!

If you have not already done so, please remember to apply for your free on-line criminal record check well in advance of any planned school activities or trips. All volunteers MUST have a clear CRC from now on in School District 68. CRC's are valid for 5 years If you would like to complete an on line application you can find a link on both the district website and Chase River School site. The process is straight forward and requires you correctly answer a series of confidential questions pertaining to your In most cases the CRC is personal history. completed in a few days and the approval is sent to the district office. From there it is forwarded to the school. If however, the applicant's name and or date of birth coincides with another individual who has a criminal record the applicant will be notified by the RCMP that they require further steps to have their CRC approved. The district is not notified when this occurs. Many thanks to those parents who have already completed the process in expectation they will be driving for field trips or helping in the school. As mentioned previously, parents who completed a CRC last year are cleared for 5 years from the date of their approval.

Thanks for helping to support the safety of all our children.

PARKING

One of the big challenges we face at Chase River School is an ongoing lack of safe convenient parking. Drop off and pick-up after school combined with our bus route creates a challenging situation. Sharing the street with the school are homes and small businesses. On several occasions our neighbours have reported collisions, dents and scratches that resulted when parents reverse out of a parking spot and back onto the road. At the end of the day there are many children crossing the road with and without a parent to get to a waiting car, putting themselves at risk. In an effort to create a safer situation at the front of the school I would like to ask parents to reverse into parking spots so that they are driving forward onto the road. Thank you for not parking in the staff parking area. This is not a safe area for students to be moving about. We continue to look at ways to better accommodate the bus and parking situation at the front of the school.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP

Students in grade 6 and 7 have the opportunity to contribute to the effective day to day running of Chase River School by taking responsibility for a variety of scheduled duties through-out the school and playground. Participation is required for grade 7 students and voluntary for grade 6's. Jobs include tasks like daily announcement, lunch hour office monitor, putting out the flags and road signs. Their contribution makes a difference every day and they are learning important skills like public speaking, answering the phone in a professional manner, and demonstrating responsibility. **Many Thanks!** - to our student leaders.

Message from Education Minister Mike Bernier

Dear Parent,

I'm writing today to ask you to share your opinions with the Ministry of Education as we work to update student reporting in kindergarten through Grade 9. Students in these grades are experiencing B.C.'s new curriculum in classrooms in every part of the province.

We are adapting the curriculum in B.C. schools so kids learn the skills they need to succeed in our changing world. This means we also need to develop a new reporting approach. Right now the progress of your child is reported in many different ways, including report cards, parent teacher meetings, and regular student/parent/teacher check-ins.

Reporting is all about keeping parents like you informed, and we want you to tell us HOW you want to be informed and keep track of your child's progress. Until February 28 next year you can submit your thoughts online at engage.gov.bc.ca/yourkidsprogress.

As well, community meetings will be held in 10 communities across the province over the coming months so parents can ask questions and share their input. Check the website for times and locations as they are scheduled.

The ultimate goal of this engagement is to develop a student reporting process that gives families a deeper understanding of their child's progress at school through timely and comprehensive information. We'll gather the feedback and share our plan next June.

Our education system is one of the most highly ranked in the world. Students are finding success in music, in academics, in sports – and in every subject in between. Together parents, teachers, and the education system are making sure we build on that for an even better tomorrow.
