## A few words about Halloween costumes

Since we are a school, and a school that has children as young as 4 years old, we ask that parents and students keep this in mind when preparing costumes to be worn at school. **Costumes should not have guns, swords (weapons of any kind)**, **nor excessive gore**.

Masks can be worn in the classroom with teacher permission. They cannot be worn outside or in the hallways. This is for safety reasons..

Also, our school dress code still applies even on Halloween. This is one of those things that we ask for parents and students to use good judgment and to pick costumes that respect the viewer and the wearer.

Primary classroom teachers have asked that children bring a change of clothes so they can change out of their costume at recess. This is to avoid the inevitable damage that occurs to costumes during outside play. This is a good idea for all students.

Please do not send treats for the entire class with your child as we are not allowed to share food with each other.

Finally, in order to follow our healthy school guidelines, we ask that the children bring <u>only one</u> Halloween candy treat *per day* to school the following week. Please help us by ensuring your child does not bring too much candy to school. If we find that a child has an inordinate amount of candy, we will hold it in the office until the end of the school day.

#### **INCLEMENT WEATHER**

As we reach the end of October we have seen some of the cool wet weather we would expect in the Fall. In previous years the question "Is it an inside day?" would be



asked. As shared at the start of the year there will not be "inside days" this year unless it is an emergency.

This means you can expect students will be going outside to play at recess and lunch. We thank you for ensuring your child comes to school with appropriate rain and cool weather clothing.

### **RUNNING CLUB**

We have continued operating our running club. Like most things at this time, it is being done a bit differently this year. Classes have scheduled



running times and they only run in their learning groups.

Something that is not different is students will continue to receive a ribbon at the following km ran marks – 10, 25, 50, 75, 100, 125, 150, 175, 200. Every 3 laps a student does is equal to a km.
