### A few words about Halloween costumes

Since we are a school, and a school that has children as young as 4 years old, we ask that parents and students keep this in mind when preparing costumes to be worn at school. **Costumes should not have guns, swords (weapons of any kind), nor excessive gore**.

Masks can be worn in the classroom with teacher permission. They cannot be worn outside or in the hallways. This is for safety reasons.

Also, our school dress code still applies even on Halloween. This is one of those things that we ask for parents and students to use good judgment and to pick costumes that respect the viewer and the wearer.



Primary classroom teachers have asked that children bring a change of clothes so they can change out of their costume at recess. This is to avoid the inevitable damage that occurs to costumes during outside play. This is a good idea for all students.

Finally, in order to follow our healthy school guidelines, we ask that the children bring <u>only one</u> Halloween candy treat *per day* to school the following week. Please help us by ensuring your child does not bring too much candy to school. We know a lot of sugar is not helpful for learning. If we find that a child has an inordinate amount of candy, we will hold it for them until the end of the school day.
